19	On February 2, 2016, defendant Muhanad Badawi ("Defendant"), by and through hi		
20	counsel Katherine Corrigan, moved the Court for an order finding that there is reasonable		
21	cause to believe that defendant may presently be suffering from a mental disease or defect		
22	rendering him mentally incompetent to the extent that he is unable to understand the nature		
23	and consequences of the proceedings against him or to assist properly in his defense.		
24	Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 4241(a), plaintiff United States of America, by and through		
25	its counsel, the United States Attorney's Office for the Central District of California, has		
26	requested that the Court issue an order pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 4241(b) requiring that an		
27	examination of the defendant be conducted, and that a report be filed with the court,		
28			

pursuant to the provisions of section 4247 (b) and (c) prior any hearing on the defendant's motion.

Based on defendant's submissions and on the government's motion,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 1. The defendant is hereby committed to the custody of the Attorney General for placement in a suitable facility for the conduct of an examination of the defendant to determine whether there is reasonable cause to believe that the defendant may presently be suffering from a mental disease or defect rendering him mentally incompetent to the extent that he is unable to understand the nature and consequences of the proceedings against him or to assist properly in his defense.
- 2. That the examination of defendant be conducted by the Federal Bureau of Prisons pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 4241(b).
- 3. That the Federal Bureau of Prisons is to submit a report to the Court regarding the results of the examination pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 4241(b) and §4247(c) on or before February 26, 2016, absent further court order.
- 4. That pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 4241(d), the Court will hold a hearing on March 8, 2016 at 12:00 p.m. in Courtroom 9D of the above-entitled Court to determine whether there is reasonable cause to believe that the defendant may presently be suffering from a mental disease or defect rendering him mentally incompetent to the extent that he is unable to understand the nature and consequences of the proceedings against him or to assist properly in his defense.
